

Camp Companion Policies

Kitten/Cat Adoption Policies

Camp Companion is devoted to helping stray and feral cats that would not be sterilized if not through our clinic. This program is called trap/neuter/return. Our program commits to leave each property that we visit with no cat/kitten that is not spayed/neutered. The kittens that are available for adoption from Camp Companion are those kittens that were to young at the time we did spay/neuter at any given farm/property.

Kitten/cat Vet Work:

1. Each kitten/cat is given the following:
 - Feline Leukemia / FIV Testing
 - Distemper
 - Rabies – if age appropriate
 - Spay/Neuter – each kitten will be altered before adoption
 - Dewormer

Juvenile Spay/Neuter – Camp Companion completes spay/neuter at 12 weeks of age unless a veterinarian recommends differently. Juvenile spay/neuter is safe for kittens/puppies and is done with great regularity all over the United States.

Puppy/Dog Adoption Policies

2. Each puppy/dog is given the following:
 - Heartworm Testing
 - Distemper
 - Rabies – if age appropriate
 - Spay/Neuter – each puppy will be altered before adoption
 - Dewormer

Camp Companion Requirements

Each kitten/cat will be adopted for a \$90.00 adoption fee. Each puppy/dog will be adopted for a \$200.00 adoption fee. This will include all vet work as mentioned.

- You must be 18 year or older.
- You must complete an adoption contract.
- You must be aware that kittens/puppies have a lifespan of 15-20 years. If you are not able to make that commitment we ask that you look at an adult cat/dog.
- We ask that you provide landlord information.
- We ask that you provide veterinarian information. (*Providing veterinarian information allows Camp Companion to contact your veterinarian for verification of history of your pets*)

Children or Other Pets

Our policy is that each kitten/puppy will be evaluated as appropriate for that families circumstance. Camp Companion can refuse adoption if they feel the children are not age appropriate for the safety of the kitten. Camp Companion may also refuse adoption if they feel that the home environment (other pets) may not be appropriate for any certain kitten/puppy.
